Help Plan Your Park – Palo Corona Regional Park

Carmel CA, June 24, 2021 – You are invited to share in visualizing the future amenities of Palo Corona Regional Park – Rancho Canada Unit at a Virtual Community Planning Meeting.

The Monterey Peninsula Regional Park District (MPRPD) is seeking public input at a Virtual Community Planning Meeting to discuss amenities of the Palo Corona Regional Park – Rancho Canada Unit on Wednesday, June 30 from 6:30 pm - 8:00 pm. The community is encouraged to join in the design conversation of these elements by participating via telephone or computer audio. A subsequent outdoor in-person Open House is scheduled for Saturday, July 17 from 10 am - 1 pm at Palo Corona Regional Park. The “Plan Your Park: Your Nature Space – Your Plan” sessions will introduce the community to the proposed services and concept plans which emerged from the previous two-year General Development Plan outreach process. “Palo Corona Regional Park will be a park for everyone seeking a nature-based experience,” said Rafael Payan, MPRPD’s General Manager. Payan added, “Palo Corona Regional Park offers 4,800-acres of open space managed by MPRPD. The Rancho Canada Unit, formerly the Rancho Canada Golf Club, is presently the primary launch point to the entire park and is MPRPD’s main location for administration, operations, and other services for our park visitors.”

MPRPD’s General Development Plan incorporated public input to transform the former golf course into a nature-based park. The first in a series of public engagement opportunities, the June 30 virtual community planning meeting will discuss the Rancho Canada Unit’s “preferred alternative” uses. Designed with inclusivity for visitors of all abilities, the park’s features being considered include a nature-based children’s playground, dog park, outdoor classroom with a wildlife viewing platform, multi-use paths, and an amphitheater.

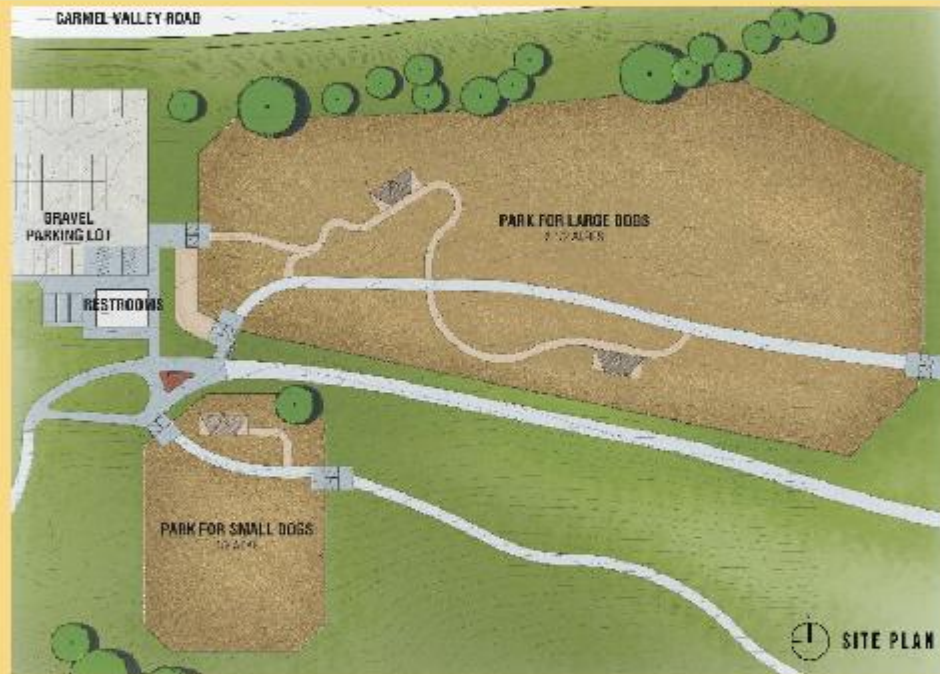
