NOTICE OF VACANCY

Interested persons are hereby notified pursuant to Government Code §1780 that there is a vacancy on the Monterey Peninsula Regional Park District (MPRPD) Board of Directors (Board). The Ward 3 seat represents the Cities of Monterey, southwest Seaside, southern Sand City, and Del Rey Oaks. (Please see map of Ward 3 on page 2 of this Notice.) The term runs through December 31, 2022. The Board meets monthly, generally on the second Wednesday.

ELIGIBILITY:

In order to qualify for appointment to this Board position, you must be 1) a resident of Ward 3 **and** 2) qualified to vote in elections as a resident of Ward 3.

The Monterey Peninsula Regional Park District is a special district sub-division of the State of California and was established by voters in 1972 and entrusted to acquire lands for the express purpose of preserving open space and providing recreational opportunities. Since its inception, MPRPD has successfully protected approximately 14,000 acres of open space and acquired, or helped to acquire a total of 24 parks and open spaces.

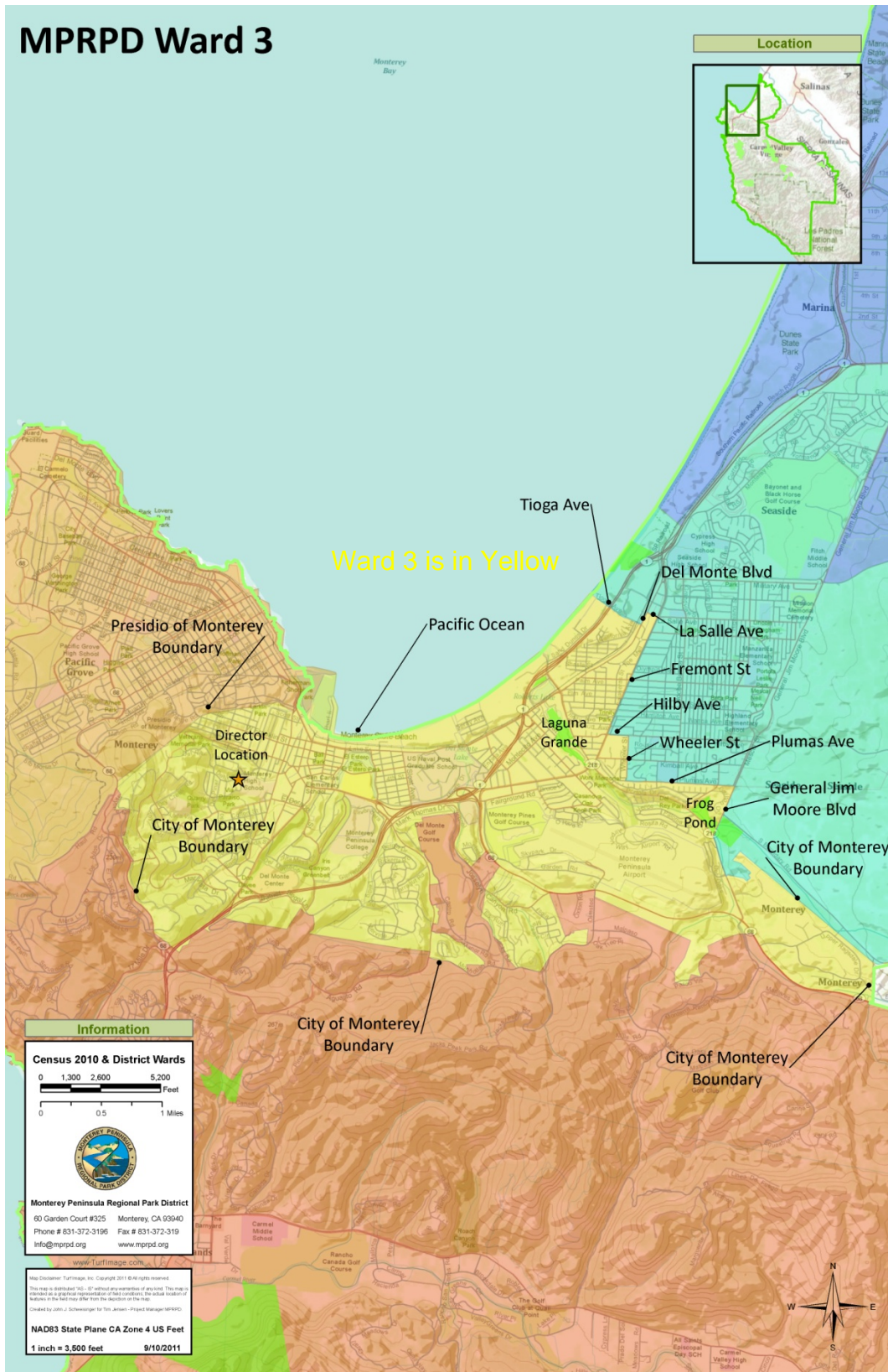


Figure 7 – Map of Ward 3 showing description of boundary.
